So here's how it works:

Prizes will be given out to the first Grad student/students that complete the challenge with Proof of attendance.

What determines Proof:

You or your group members must take pictures of each event completed **WITH THE GSO SYMBOL CLEARLY SEEN IN THE PICTURE.** Symbols can include Promotion items (cups, t shirts, landyards) or you can draw the GSO logo on a piece of paper.

Some group rules:

- Challenge can be completed by one or more students (Groups of any size are allowed)
- This competition is only valid for current students enrolled as a SU Graduate Student.
- Challenge Completion for Prizes will be at FOUR different levels 30%=41 Events; 60%=81 Events; 80%=108 Events; 100%=135 Events
 Once a student/students has received a prize for one level they will not be allowed to compete for other levels.

The goal of this challenge is to provide an incentive to get you off the Syracuse University campus when it's possible this year and exploring what Central New York has to offer. As you complete more events the better the prizes.
